NCEA Change Package 2019—On 13 May, the Minister of Education made a significant pre-budget announcement around NCEA this can be found in full at <u>www.beehive.govt.nz/feature/wellbeing-budget-2019</u>. Based on the findings of the 2018 schools and community engagement phase, the Ministry of Education will now work with key stakeholders on the detailed design of the following seven changes: Making NCEA more accessible, equity for Maori, strengthening of literacy and numeracy requirements, having fewer but larger standards, simplifying NCEA's structure, showing clearer pathways to further education and employment, and keeping Level One NCEA as optional. NZQA fees will no longer be charged for participating in NCEA and New Zealand Scholarship, effective immediately (although this applies to Domestic students only).

Staffing—Congratulations to Mrs Tracy Dockrill upon her appointment to the role of Director of Boarding. Mrs Dockrill joined the Boarding House staff six years ago, during a time when our Junior students were housed "temporarily" in Unwin Hall following the disruption caused by the 2011 Christchurch Earthquake. She has seen huge changes over that time, especially with our building development and ensuring that our pastoral care systems meet the needs of today's young women who are Boarders. Acting as Boarding Director since last year, Mrs Dockrill (right) has gained invaluable skills and knowledge in how to effectively operate a Boarding House, giving her the edge over the other quality applicants. **Mrs Nicky Merritt** (left) will continue as our **Deputy Boarding Manager**, in addition to her role as Medical Officer for the school during the day. We are very fortunate to have a great team of highly skilled, responsive, caring and empathetic staff in both the Boarding House and the school kitchen.

Two other positions are currently being advertised as vacancies on TradeMe, and on the Craighead website. Development Manager Mrs Phillipa Guerin will be stepping down from this role mid-year, while Director of Sport Mrs Alicia Mabey will be taking a year's maternity leave from July. Both of these staff would be happy to discuss what these positions might entail with prospective applicants. The Development Manager position is half time, and term time only, while the Director of Sport is full time and while flexible in hours, may involve some weekend work. If you know of people who might suit either of these important roles, please encourage them to apply.
